Sophomore College Trip - Wingate University

March 15, 2018

On Thursday, March 15th 2018, 10th grade students will have the opportunity to participate in a field trip to Wingate University. To participate students must have passed at least 5 of 6 classes 1st semester. If you have been suspended for more than 2 days this school year you are not eligible to participate. The cost of the trip is \$20. This covers the cost of transportation by charter bus.

UNC Charlotte Passport Program

March 7th at 2:45 pm, Room C227

Join us on March 7th at 2:45pm in room C227 to learn more about the Passport Program. The UNC Charlotte Passport Coordinator, Jordan Bullington will share details about the program, the selection process, and what to expect as a Passport student. The Passport Program is UNC Charlotte's distinctive transfer program for academically qualified freshman. Qualified applicants are selected by UNC Charlotte for this competitive program based on their academic background including performance in high school coursework and competitive scores on either the SAT or ACT standardized tests. These students begin their college career at Central Piedmont Community College where they will receive targeted academic advising, student support services, and student life opportunities on both campuses to ensure a seamless and successful transition to UNC Charlotte.

State Employees Credit Union Foundation (SECU) "People Helping People" Scholarship

Deadline is April 20, 2018

Since the SECU Foundation was established in August 2004, it has awarded annual \$10,000 "People Helping People" four-year scholarships – to graduating seniors attending North Carolina Charter Schools. These scholarships will be awarded to students attending one of the 16 constituent campuses of the University of North Carolina. These funds are made possible through the contributions to the Foundation by members of State Employees' Credit Union. Review the [Eligibility Criteria](#) set forth by SECU Foundation. Eligible students should complete [Scholarship Interest Form](#) to be considered for MICS's nomination. Interest forms are due to Mrs. Honoré by 2:30PM on Wednesday, February 28th.

The North Carolina Child Support Council Scholarship

Deadline is April 20, 2018

The North Carolina Child Support Council will award (3) \$1,000.00 scholarships (\$500 per semester) to 3 seniors in the state of North Carolina. Criteria is as follows:

1. At least one parent must be a member of the North Carolina Child Support Council or a client of the Child Support Program (through either Child Support services or Clerk of Court services).
2. Applicant must be a resident of North Carolina and a graduating high school senior.
3. Applicant must have been accepted by a North Carolina school of higher learning: a College, University, Community College or Technical School. Applicant needs to attach a copy of the acceptance letter.
4. Applicant must have maintained an overall C average or above during his/her high school career.

The North Carolina Child Support Council Scholarship Application is attached for seniors who will enter a North Carolina school of higher learning in the fall of 2018. **All [applications](#) must be postmarked by April 20, 2018**

Wrestling



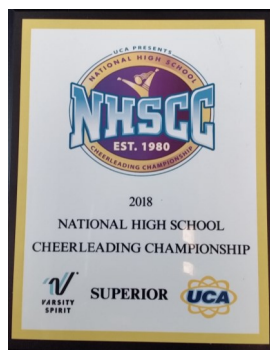
