# Academic Excellence, Positive Character, Service, and Leadership

#### School

MICS is a K-12 school, enrolling 1789 students, with 564 students in high school. MICS began in 2010 and had its first graduating class in 2016. MICS has an extensive waitlist due to its proven ability to graduate productive students who have thrived under structure, including, but not limited to, a strict discipline and dress code policy. MICS leverages its K–12 structure to create meaningful internship and mentorship opportunities across all grade levels, cultivating a supportive community where high school students serve as positive role models for younger peers. MICS is a multicultural school where character education and academic excellence are the top priorities. The traditional school calendar year consists of six 60-minute classes each day.

#### Community

MICS serves the educational needs of students living in North Carolina counties surrounding Mt. Holly, which is west of the greater Charlotte area. The student body is 47% White, 33% Black, 10% Hispanic, 7% Multiracial, and 3% Other. 32% of students are eligible for free/reduced-price meals.

#### Curriculum

MICS offers three tracks designed to support academic needs and career interests: College Preparatory, Career Preparatory, and Occupational Course of Study. MICS does not limit the number of Honors/AP classes to students who succeed in the prerequisites. MICS offers Career & College Promise (CCP), which enables students to enroll in college courses and earn college credits through local community colleges. In 25-26, 47% of 11th- and 12th-grade students participated in the CCP program. 14% of students enrolled in online classes through NCVPS.

### **Graduate Accomplishments**

The MICS Class of 2025 consisted of 135 students and achieved a 100% graduation rate. 62% of graduates matriculated to a 4-year college, 25% to a 2-year college, and 13% into the workforce. A total of \$10.5 million in scholarships was offered. All seniors meet with school counselors individually to develop a post-secondary plan.
